



Information on Eligibility & Nominations

1. Hall of Fame Inductee.

Inductees to ABHF will be in four categories:

- 1.1 Player
- 1.2 Coach
- 1.3 Technical Official
- 1.4 Contributor

The awards will reflect a distinguished contribution to Australian basketball in one of these four Categories.

Awards do not have to be made in each Category in each award period.

Awards may be made posthumously.

2. Hall of Fame Inductee.

From 2017, awards are to be made in three divisions:

- 2.1 Basketball Australia;
- 2.2 WNBL; and
- 2.3 NBL.

Nominations must specify for which division the nomination is intended.

3. Eligibility

The following general guidelines apply:

- 3.1 The primary requirement is high-level achievement from personal effort or initiative, in a field of endeavour that contributes to the performances of players, technical officials, coaches, administrators, and/or to the development and status of the sport of basketball in Australia.
- 3.2 A person nominated may have made a major distinguished contribution to basketball at the international or national levels, NBL/WNBL, State/Association, or to the sport in general.
- 3.3 An individual may also be considered suitable if they have outstanding attributes, not otherwise listed herein but who, in the opinion of the BA Honours and Awards Commission, qualifies for an Australian Basketball Hall of Fame nomination.

3.4 Mere long-term service or involvement with basketball by a candidate without having satisfied the primary requirements of the nomination criteria, or having demonstrated outstanding achievement arising from personal initiative or innovation, is not sufficient justification for selection. The Hall of Fame is not recognition for service in its own right, or limited achievements, but for distinguished achievement.

[More detailed eligibility criteria are contained in Basketball Australia's By-law 12].

4. Legend Award

The Legend Award is the ultimate award in the Hall of Fame and can be made only to persons who have previously been inducted into it.

An ABHF Legend nomination is restricted to those whose association with Australian basketball has reached "legend" status, who have previously been inducted into the Hall of Fame, and whose service to basketball and Basketball Australia is worthy of the highest honour in Australia in the sport of basketball.

Legend nominations will generally be originated by the Honours and Awards Commission's Screening Committee.
