Basketball Australia has developed a code of conduct to guide the behaviour of all directors and staff involved with Australian Basketball.

- The Code of Conduct applies to Directors, Employees, Contractors and Volunteers of Basketball Australia, State and Territory Associations and other BA sanctioned or recognised competitions and events.
- The Code of Conduct outlines 13 responsibilities relating to:
 - Promoting compliance with policies
 - Being a positive role model
 - Acting professionally and with integrity
 - Acting honestly and fairly
 - Not making improper use of your position
 - o Maintaining confidentiality when required
 - Showing respect for others
 - o Not engaging in conduct that is harmful to the sport
 - Acting with care and diligence
 - o Being accountable
 - Not displaying or transmitting inappropriate content
 - o Not promoting personal beliefs that conflict with those of Australian basketball
 - Respect local laws and customs
- Basketball Australia has an Integrity Unit and may conduct investigations into breaches of the Code of Conduct.
