Ivor Burge Men: Tasmania 118 def. New South Wales 38

Tasmania secured third spot on the ladder heading into the Semi-Finals on the back of Joshua Cleary's 37 points and 26 rebounds. It was a must win game for NSW and Keelan Crawford did his best with 12 points and eight boards but they could not match the offensive power that Tas had in the front court.

Ivor Burge Men: ACT 123 def. Western Australia 39

Needing a victory to move into the top four, ACT's Jack Littleton and Justin Koenig delivered. Littleton notched 37 points and pulled down 17 rebounds but it was Koenig who led the way with one of the best performances of the tournament, recording 38 points, 33 boards and 13 steals for a monstrous triple-double. Kyron Timms paced WA with a double-double of his own- 12 points and 12 rebounds.

Ivor Burge Men: Victoria 110 def. South Australia 78

In a battle for top spot on the ladder, two undefeated teams met on the final day of the pool games and Bradley Kinross got SA off to a hot start, finishing with 19 points. Eventually Victoria began to pull away though and their superior bench play and depth shone through as their second unit tallied 54 points while Jake De La Motte collected 30 points and nine steals to seal first place for the Vics.

U20 Women: New South Wales 84 def. Western Australia 40

New South Wales put themselves in a great position for the bronze medal playoff with a convincing win over Western Australia. Cassidy McLean shot out of the blocks, starring at both ends of the floor to finish with 23 points and a pair of blocks and while WA were gallant, they did not have the firepower to match their opponents with Jemma Gatti's nine points and six rebounds a highlight

U20 Women: Queensland 107 def. Tasmania 54

Officially booking themselves into the gold medal playoff, Qld remained undefeated with a comprehensive performance against Tas who fought hard behind Paige French's 13 points. Qld were deadly from all areas of the court though, scoring 72 points in the paint and shooting 50% from deep as Miela Goodchild put up a game-high 28 points.

Ivor Burge Women: New South Wales 88 def. Western Australia 33

Dominating inside, NSW recorded 74 points around the rim to take care of WA and clinch a spot in the bronze medal playoff. Zora Hines was efficient with 28 points in 26 minutes and Lisa Mackie had ten points and ten rebounds while WA were led by another brilliant performance from Kristy Carter (24 points, 13 boards).

U20 Women: Victoria 87 def. South Australia 56

Victoria will now set their sights on a re-match against Queensland, who they fell to earlier this week, after earning a place in the gold medal match with a victory over SA. The Redbacks equalled the Victorians inside, courtesy of Darcy Rees' 15 points in 20 minutes, with both teams scoring 34 points in the paint but Jazmin Shelley's speed proved difficult to contain as she recorded 29 points while the Vic bench finished their opponents off with 40 points.

U20 Men: NBA Global Academy 87 def. A.C.T 71

Behind double-double machine Glenn Morison [19 points, ten rebounds], ACT opened up a first-half advantage and while the Global Academy came back at them after the main break, his efforts down low looked like they may hold off the international side. Tamuri Wigness took control though, with his high-intensity play yielding 25 points, 13 rebounds and seven assists to win the game for the Global Academy and take them into a playoff for fifth spot.

U20 Men: New South Wales 90 def. Tasmania 71

After a devastating loss last night, NSW regrouped to defeat Tas but they did not do it easily with the guys from the Apple Isle owning a six-point lead in the first half. Six Tassie players hit double-digits led by Brady Armstrong's 15 points but NSW's bench wrestled the momentum in the second half as they scored 41 points. Hunter Goodrick was the pick of the Sky Blues' players with 18.

U20 Men Semi Final: South Australia 98 def. Western Australia 71

Reigning Champions South Australia showed why they could defend their title with a supreme performance against WA in the Semi-Final. The West Australians led early behind Alex Ducas [22 points] but Alex Mudronja kept SA close before finishing with 24 points. Brodie Nathan was the spark though, having averaged seven points per game leading into this contest, he recorded 21 points in a stunning display to lead SA into the gold medal playoff on Day 6.

Ivor Burge Women: Victoria 64 def. A.C.T. 41

Victoria solidified themselves as the team to beat in the Ivor Burge women, executing all afternoon on offence as Danielle Phillips and Jess McCulloch added 15 points apiece with McCulloch also pulling down 19 rebounds. Taylor Anderson kept ACT close for as long as she could, finishing with 17 points of her own.

U20 Men Semi-Final: Victoria 80 def. Queensland 70

Not used to the underdog tag, Victoria resolved themselves in an epic Semi-Final to pull off an upset and book a spot against SA in the Grand Final. Their defence was exemplary, led by Matthew Johns who did not allow any easy shots from the Queenslanders including Kody Stattmann who still had 18 points and 11 rebounds but on 33% shooting. With the game still in the balance down the stretch, Sean MacDonald came to the party with a couple of huge and-one plays, taking his tally to 21 points and eventually giving Vic a double-digit win. Qld will now look to bounce back against WA for the bronze medal.

Ivor Burge Men Semi-Final: Victoria 137 def. A.C.T. 55

Victoria had proven dominant throughout the pool stage and that form continued into the Semi-Finals, again easily clearing the century mark courtesy of Jake De La Motte [31 points, ten steals] and Cameron Slacik [19 points, 18 rebounds]. Jack Littleton again starred for ACT, finishing with 16 points and nine rebounds and his efforts will go a long way to claiming the bronze medal on Day 6.

Ivor Burge Men Semi-Final: South Australia 106 def. Tasmania 67

SA will get a second shot at Victoria after falling to them in the group stage, securing a spot in the gold medal playoff via a dominant performance under the rim. They scored 60 points in the paint to almost outscore Tasmania's total with Wayne Kinross totalling a game-high 30 points and countering the efforts of Dylan Pace [24 points, 14 rebounds].

Ivor Burge Women: Japan 146 def. South Australia 16

Locked in from distance from the outset, Japan shot SA out of the game with their three-pointers, led by Mio Koyasu. They will now head into the gold medal game full of confidence after Maya Senda had another great performance with 30 points and 17 assists while SA's Amy Howard never gave up the fight to add six points to the scoreboard.

Ivor Burge Men Playoff: New South Wales 89 def. Western Australia 46

Aiming to bounce back from a loss earlier in the day, WA were intent on crashing the glass and Kyron Timms pulled down a massive 27 boards to go with 13 points. He tried to rally his troops but NSW were too strong overall, taking fifth place overall behind Keelan Crawford who had 34 points on 50% long-range shooting.

U20 Women: South Australia 91 def. A.C.T. 69

South Australia secured their spot for a re-match against New South Wales in the bronze medal playoff after a convincing performance on Day 5. Six players notched double-figures as they drained shots from everywhere as a team. Callie Bourne was efficient for ACT with 23 points but SA's Sam Simons finished with a game-high 24.

U20 Women: Western Australia 66 def. Tasmania 53

WA got off the bottom of the ladder with the final game of the Under-20 women's group stage, coming from behind to defeat Tasmania. Sharna Thompson [21 points, ten boards] looked to have her side in control as they pushed their advantage out to as much as 16 points but a brilliant last quarter from WA sent shockwaves through the Tas roster. Captain Georgia Denehey produced a double-double of her own with 16 points and ten rebounds while Maddison Hooper's sparkling offensive game saw her tally 20 points in the inspiring victory.

U20 Men Playoff: Tasmania 68 def. A.C.T. 59

Rounding out Day 5, Tasmania grabbed seventh spot on the ladder with their first win of the tournament. It was a tightly-contested first half but once again Glenn Morison [24 points] controlled the paint for ACT. However, out of the main break, Tas increased their defensive intensity around the rim and began to force turnovers, from which they scored 15 points. Brady Armstrong enjoyed the change in tempo, lead three players into double-figure scoring with 15 points of his own.
