All participants who are members of Basketball Australia, a Member Organisation or an Authorised Provider

When does the policy apply?

- Any involvement with Basketball Australia or it's representative
- Any dealings people have in their capacity as a participant
- In a persons standing as a participant in general

It does NOT include;

- An interaction where the only link is one or more of the individuals are a participant under the policies
- Any subsequent conduct that does not directly relate to basketball
- Where an issue would be more appropriately dealt with under a different policy

What is Prohibited Conduct?

- Abuse
- Bullying
- Harassment
- Sexual Misconduct
- Unlawful discrimination
- Victimisation
- Vilification
