



## NATIONAL INTEGRITY FRAMEWORK - QUICK FACTS

Basketball Australia has developed a national framework to promote and maintain integrity in basketball. The Framework sets out a robust set of reporting, investigatory and sanctioning provisions to deal with Prohibited Conduct.

The National Integrity Framework (the Framework) sets the broad expectations for the conduct of all Participants. It also incorporates detailed policies that regulate specific behaviours to ensure action can be taken against those who fail to adhere to appropriate behavioural standards and expose the sport to undue risk.

- **Each Policy defines what is Prohibited Conduct.**
- **The Integrity Framework incorporates the following seven (7) policies:**
  - Code of Conduct – Elite Level and Good Administration
  - Gambling and Match-Fixing Policy
  - Improper Use of Drugs and Medicines Policy
  - Courtsiding Policy
  - Member Protection Policy
  - Child Safeguarding Policy
  - Complaints Policy
  - Anti-Doping
- **The integrity Framework applies to:**
  - Player, coaches, officials and team support personnel at all levels
  - Those who have a role in competitions or programs that are approved by Basketball Australia, FIBA or State or Territory member associations
  - Anyone approved to provide services that contribute to the running of basketball competitions, programs and services
  - Directors, members of boards and committees, including volunteers
  - Any other person who has agreed that they will be bound by the rules in the Framework
